2024 Winter Storm Emergency - Weekly Temporary Lodging Summary - Total

A major flooding event occurred on January 22, 2024 in San Diego County. Through a region-wide damage self-report survey, 211, the County and City Local Assistance Centers, Emergency Temporary Intake Process, and calls, there were about **5,000 initial reports of property damage or other type of storm impact** to residential and commercial locations. Of those, **595 residential locations were classified as major damage**, about **2,000 were renters**, and **2,600 were owners**.


This report summarizes the current status of **1,286** households or cases managed by Equus (County contractor) and the County.


Summary

- The number of households placed in hotels declined since March 25; there were 25 fewer households April 8 compared to last Monday, April 1.
- 161 households have applied to FEMA since last Monday; 194 households have no record of an application.
- As of April 8, almost \$20 million was distributed by FEMA in the county, of which about \$4 million went to 349 placed households.



- Received assistance = FEMA assistance includes rental assistance, home repair, etc.
- Applied but no assistance indicated = may be a temporary status, such as not yet processed by FEMA or lack of documentation, or the household may not be eligible.
- No record of application = may be due to inability to match the records or households may not have applied due to miscommunication, hesitancy to contact government, etc.

*Left the program due to own choice or no longer eligible. Rarely, for non-violent offenses, one warning is given for the first Code of Conduct violation and households are asked to leave if there is a second violation.
